E. Nardizogha (or Orying maker) came forward
 and makes state, that he was living
 at a place called the Buzzard Roost
 of Chalahochey River at the a treaty
 was concluded with Gen. McIntosh a
 Creek Chief and when the boundary line
 was run between the Creeks & Cherokee
 passed near where he lived. The country
 was settled by citizens of Georgia they
 stole and destroyed his property at such
 a rate he was forced to abandon his premises
 consisting of 13 Acres of good land & Acres do
 2 Acres in a Garden 6 Fruit-Trees 1 Dwelling House
 1 Corn crib a House bought from Sweetwater
 2 Broad streat 1 Cupboard. A claimant
 further states after he was forced to
 leave said premises, he settled at Sevier
 on the Hightower River. The State of Ge
 extended her laws over our Country and
 a citizen of Georgia as against him and
 stole him of a great many of his horses
 hold furniture. The improvement abandoned
 was as follows 6 Acres of Land 3000 Rails
 1 Dwelling House. A claimant states the
 third settlement he made was on the
 Hightower River near the junction of
 Carlakalag & Hytowne he received pay for
 his improvements at that place. But when
 captured and brought off by the U.S Troop
 in the summer of 1835. he left 30 bushels
 of corn & 15 bushels of sweet-potatoes

Claimant further states that he
had a small improvement consisting
of a Building Hoop & 6 Acres of Land
situated about a mile from ~~the town~~
~~Business place~~ which was not
valued and of course he never any pay
for it. Claimant states that all the
articles contained in the foregoing
Chain was either taken by the soldiers
of the United States or he was forced
to abandon them when he was captured
in the year 1818. All of which he
has never received any pay for
or any part thereof from the United
States or any other source
