Beple Buffalo Fish States on oath that about the year 1829 he had stolen from him by white people citizens of the United States a herd of Horses which horses claimant followed from where stolen to the Chatterbox - chy River but was unable to recover said horses the other Horses as specified or last mentioned in account were abandoned in the year 1838 when arrested by the U.S. Troops Claimant states the cattle were stolen when claimant lived near the creek line said cattle were stolen all at the same time and taken in La. from where claimant was unable to recover said cattle the Hogs about eighty of them were taken from claimant when he moved from the creek line up to the Fort of Covert town



to which place he brought a part of his  
trous and from said place twenty more <sup>more</sup>  
and the white people got possession of said  
and claimant never got them. The balance  
amounting to about one hundred & thirty  
were abandoned together with the things  
as set forth in the foregoing account consisting  
of various articles of farming utensils  
household furniture tools guns &c. - all of  
which claimant was obliged by arrest of  
the United States Troops to abandon in the  
year 1858 - which property claimant was  
not permitted to sell or dispose of in the  
States he was compelled several years ago  
to leave a place situated near the creek  
line and La Tim in consequence of outrages  
of the whites at which place he had im-  
proved 15 acres of land & three cribs & stables  
also 10 Apple trees & 30 Peach which place  
and improvements claimant declares  
were not valued also 20 acres of land  
not valued near his residence Etowah  
in consequence of it lying some distance  
from his dwelling and the Agents knew  
nothing of said twenty acres there was also  
fifty Peach trees planted on the above 20  
acres of cleared land also not valued  
By Agents claimant further states that  
he had cleared 5 acres of land after the  
23rd of May - 1836 and built one  
house or double houses after said  
time and they also were not valued  
by the United States agents the prop-  
erty as above specified nor no part  
thereof has claimant ever received  
or received any compensation <sup>for the same</sup> from  
the United States or any other  
service sworn to & subscribed  
before me March 30th 1842 -

that he was near neighbour of claim-  
ant & knew of his having stolen  
from <sup>him</sup> at various times the horses and  
cattle as specified in the foregoing acc<sup>t</sup>  
also Witness States he knew of the  
traps being taken by White Citizens of  
of the United States when claimant  
was compelled to remove from near  
the Cape and La. The smaller items  
as charged Witness <sup>States</sup> Claimant did leave  
and abandon in consequence of being  
arrested by the United States troops  
in the year 1838 - the places as  
specified Witness States he was well  
acquainted with and that the said  
places were not valued nor anything  
pertaining thereto by the United States  
valuing Agents appointed for that  
purpose Witness further States  
that Claimant cleared 5 acres of  
land & built 2 houses after the  
23<sup>rd</sup> of May - 1836 - which improve-  
ments were never valued nor has  
Claimant received any of the above  
property or any part thereof nor  
compensation for the same from  
the United States or any source  
known to & subscribed before on March  
5<sup>th</sup> 1842
